



Croquet CNSW COVID-19 Guidelines

Date of Guideline: 25 February 2022: Changes since last guideline (January 15, 2021): No government restrictions for playing croquet or using clubhouses.

Executive Summary

There are no restrictions on playing croquet or social club gatherings after croquet. Masks no longer need to be worn inside or outside and QR codes should not be used.

Individuals are now responsible for managing their COVID-19 infection (see <https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/management/advice-for-confirmed>)

1. Risk Reduction Strategies

Clubs should consider adopting risk reduction strategies to reduce the risk of COVID-19 infection. Such strategies could include:

- No member should play if unwell.
- Clean any shared equipment
- Follow social distancing
- Use disposable items and do not share food
- Applying rules of admission, including vaccination status

2. CNSW Competitions

Players in CNSW competitions need to be double vaccinated or have a medical exemption. Venues may also have their own more stringent requirements which would cover not only players but also officials and workers.

CNSW also encourages all involved do a Rapid Antigen Test before participation in a CNSW competition. This test should be done at home before leaving for the competition venue.
